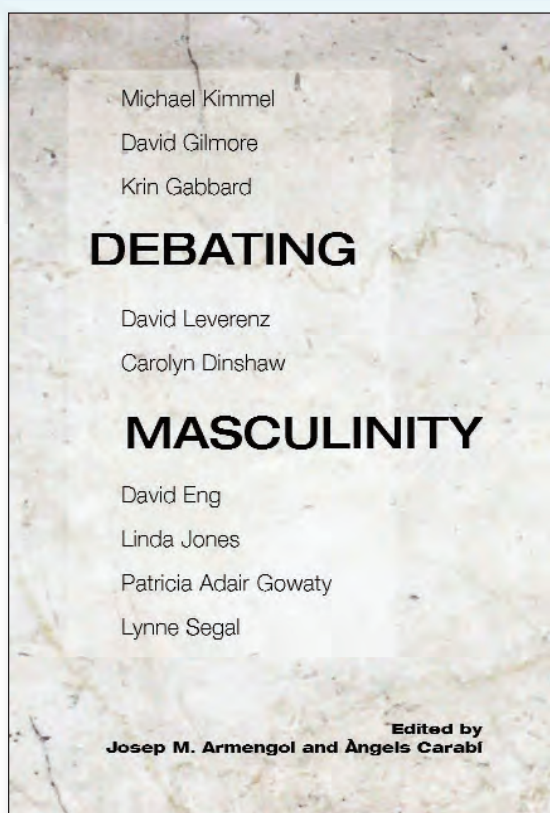

She is an international advisory editor of the journal *Men and Masculinities* and director of the research group "Constructing New Masculinities."
